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Foreword

This translation has been made based on the original Japanese Industrial Standard revised by the Minister of International Trade and Industry, through deliberations at the Japanese Industrial Standards Committee in accordance with the Industrial Standardization Law.

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Cosmetic gloves for artificial hands

1 Scope This Japanese Industrial Standard shall specify the cosmetic gloves for artificial hands (hereafter referred to as "cosmetic gloves"). However, the cosmetic gloves for infants and children shall be excluded.

2 The units and numerical values given in { } in this Standard are based on the traditional unit system and are appended for informative reference.

2 Definition of terms The definition of main terms used in this Standard shall be as follows.

- (1) **hand** general term for hand equipment for the artificial hand which has the shape of a human hand with five fingers
- (2) **cosmetic glove** gloves made of soft plastics used for masking a hand restoring the appearance of human hand as much as possible
- (3) **cosmetic hand** hands which do not move functionally, whose appearance is modified by a cosmetic glove
- (4) **utility hand** hands with the structure whereby opening and closing movement of fingers can be controlled by operating a control lead

3 Types and symbols The types and symbols shall be as shown in table 1.
