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Kraft paper sacks—For potato starch

1 Scope This Japanese Industrial Standard specifies the kraft paper sacks used for packing potato starch (hereafter referred to as “paper sacks”).

3 Definitions For the purpose of this Standard, the definitions given in **JIS P 0001** and **JIS Z 0102** apply.

4 Classification of paper sacks The paper sacks are classified into pasted kraft paper sacks (hereafter referred to as “pasted sack”) and sewn kraft paper sacks (hereafter referred to as “sewn sack”) according to the closure of tube, there divided to valved and open-mouth type according to the form of the filling mouth and grouped further by the construction of tube (shape of the end, with or without a notch at upper end corner and with or without gusset) and the construction of upper and lower ends of the paper sacks. The classes and symbols of the paper sacks are as given in table 1.

The filling mass of the paper sacks shall be 25 kg in any times.
